

GUEST MASTER TEACHERS

Lawrence M. Jackson is Professor of Dance and Assistant Dean for Faculty Affairs in the College of Visual and Performing Arts at George Mason University, where he teaches Contemporary, Jazz, Dance History, and Choreography. He previously served as Associate Chair of Dance and Director of Graduate Studies at the University of Alabama, where he also directed multiple mainstage productions.



A former member of the internationally acclaimed Cleo Parker Robinson Dance Ensemble, Jackson has performed and presented nationally and internationally, including *I Walk with Spirit* at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival. As a choreographer, he has created more than 95 original works. Most recently, he choreographed the off-Broadway production *Separate and Equal*, which was nominated for an AUDELCO Award for Best Choreography.

As a scholar of Black dance, Jackson has published widely and co-edited a landmark special issue of the *Journal of Pan African Studies* devoted entirely to Black Dance—only the second time in history an academic journal issue focused exclusively on this field. He also serves on the editorial board of *Siyabonana: The Journal of Africana Studies*.

Jackson holds a BFA in Dance from the University of Southern Mississippi and an MFA in Dance from Florida State University.



Ross Alley (Bachelor of Music RSA, Certificate, TEFL) is a native of New Zealand, who worked as a pianist and music teacher at the National School of Ballet and the Australian Ballet Company and School before moving to England. In London he was employed by the Royal Ballet School as a pianist, with responsibilities as a music tutor to develop the teacher training course and create the pianist training program for aspiring ballet accompanists. Alley is closely associated with the Cecchetti Society, researching, editing and arranging music for the syllabi. He currently lectures on classical music at the Royal Opera House.


Families are invited to attend the Student Demonstration and Scholarship Awards.

CLASSES

Classes are open to dancers who are at least 11 years of age with a minimum of three years of ballet training. It is not necessary to be familiar with the Cecchetti method to attend. Teachers will choose a track of course work. Whether new to the Cecchetti method or looking to further Cecchetti training, teachers' needs are met with this curriculum. Classes will be held in the Mason Gross School of the Arts. Each studio is equipped with sound system and sprung dance floors.

HOUSING

Students will be housed at the Rutgers University Inn and Conference Center located across the street from the dance studios. All rooms are double occupancy, including a 100% smoke free environment, hypo-allergenic linens, complimentary WiFi, coffee makers, microwave and refrigerator, toiletries, and hairdryer. University Inn rooms are limited. We suggest registering early in order to insure availability. Overflow attendees will be housed in Rutgers University dorm facilities.
